Retailers are asking municipalities to designate the parking stalls used for the Click & Collect deliveriesas partof the licensed premises on the alcohol licensed premises must include all areas where cohol is stored or sold, and alcohol cannot be sold outside those areas. In other words, without the expansion of the licensed premises to include the pick-up area, alcohol cannot be included in Click ellect sales. Outside the City of Milwaukee, licensed areas do not need to be contiguous, allowing cific parking talls to be designated for Click collectal coholsales.

A municipality has discretion overhether to allow the expanded premises.municipality should evaluate applications uniformly but granting one request for extended premises does not require granting all subsequent requests consistent set of guidelines or criteria for reviewing these requests supportensistent review of these application ordering and delivery only require municipal proval if alcohol is include when a municipality takes the time to evaluate the application to expand the licensed premises, it does not delay all Click & Collects ales, just alcohol sales.

Wine "Clubs" and other Direct Shippers are not analogous to Click Collect

While there are some similarities, direct shipment of wine is not analogous o Click & Collect:

- Wine is not part of a larger purchase that includes range of products.
- Direct shippersare vintners, notlocal retailers as in Click & Collect.
- Licensing direct shipping of wine is the statutory responsibility of the Wisconsin Department oRevenuewhilelocalalcoholretailingis the statutoryresponsibilityof municipal government.

An out-of-state winery holding a Direct Shipper's Permit from the Wisconsin Department of Revenuemay ship their products directly to individuals in Wisconsine delivery must be face-to-face, with a signedeceipt indicating the recipient is age 21 or olderWisconsin resident may have only 108 literabout 140 bottles/12 cases) shipped directly to them annually. A Direct Shipper's Permit is alsequired for Wisconsin wineries to ship out of the state.
