The fellow has the opportunity to par cipate in clinical research projects of their own design or with ongoing projects at MCW, FMLH, CHW, VAMC, UWM and MU.
- 2) Par cipant's pa ent care and supervisory responsibili es: The Fellow will be involved in adult and pediatric outpa ent spas city clinics within the department of PM&R. Rota ons in Orthopedic surgery, Neurology and Neurosurgery will be arranged based on individual candidates interests. The Fellow will be involved in assessing and consul ng on inpa ents with spas city and neurorehabilita ve needs. Addi onally the Fellow will a end outpa ent physical therapy and occupa onal therapy sessions as it relates to spas city management including exercise, serial cas ng, and electrical s mula on. The Fellow will observe various surgical procedures including tendon transfers/lengthening, placement of intrathecal pumps, and dorsal rhizotomies.
