

If you are an incoming/new student, the process begins by completing the [Certification of Finances](#).

This form requires creation of a Dynamic Forms account before it can be completed. For instructions on how to create a Dynamic Forms account, [click here](#).

Since DACA recipients are not eligible for federal financial aid, you do not need to file the FAFSA. However, you may apply with admissions directly for any merit-based scholarships. Please contact your respective admissions office for full details. Keep in mind that scholarships are extremely limited in number and dollar amount. You should have a plan to pay for your education with alternative means.

One option to pay for school would be a private educational loan. You will need to find a lender for DACA students, most of whom require a credit worthy co-signer. You are free to use any lender of your choice. Do your research to make sure they are reputable and have repayment options that will work for your situation.
